Results from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Student Experience in the Research University (SERU) Survey

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Introduction

What is the SERU Survey?

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is participating in the SERU (Student Experience in the Research University) project, which is a collaborative effort among various (mostly public) AAU institutions. Developed by the University of California at Berkeley, the purpose of the SERU project is to develop "new data sources and policy relevant analysis to help broaden our understanding of the undergraduate experience and to promote a culture of institutional self-improvement" at large, public research universities. A major advantage of participating in the SERU project is the ability to compare responses of Carolina students with those of their counterparts at other research universities at the program level. The University adopted SERU as its primary survey about the undergraduate student experience, replacing the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE), which was last administered in 2010. Survey Structure

The SERU survey consists of three parts asked of all students:

<u>Academic Engagement</u>: includes questions about classroom participation, assignment completion, time allocation toward academic and non-academic activities, academic and personal development, institutional climate for diversity, plans and aspirations, and overall satisfaction

<u>Program Evaluation</u>: includes questions regarding students' experiences in their declared major or in their overall courses, as applicable

<u>Background and Personal Characteristics</u>: includes questions about paying for college expenses, family history, current living situation, and other demographics

After these questions have been answered, students are randomly assigned to one of the two modules below:

<u>Academic Experience and Globalization</u>: includes questions regarding why students chose UNC, importance of attending a research university, participation in activities, and global awareness

<u>Community and Civic Engagement</u>: includes questions regarding on- and off-campus involvement in community service, service-learning course participation, and civic engagement

Respondent Demographics

The survey was administered to all UNC-Chapel Hill undergraduates. A total of 7,320 students responded, yielding a response rate of 39%. The tables below show a comparison of the respondent versus population demographics. These tables indicate that the respondents to the SERU survey were generally representative of the undergraduate student population.
